Applicants are expected to have the ability to obtain external funding and the willingness to actively contribute to our research centers, such as the SFB 823 "Statistical modelling of nonlinear dynamic processes".

The tasks of the successful candidate comprise an adequate involvement in teaching, e.g., statistics for economics and social studies. We expect social and leadership competencies. While knowledge of German is desirable, it is not a requirement for the position.
